MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES

In today's Gospel from Luke, we read about the healing of a man possessed by a demon named "Legion," which Jesus casts out. As a companion to the Gospel, we'll sing Charles Wesley's beloved hymn "O for a thousand tongues to sing." Charles Wesley, who alongside his brother John, was a leader of the Methodist movement, wrote this text on May 21, 1739, the first anniversary of his evangelical conversion. Peter Böhler, the Moravian bishop who was instrumental in this conversion a year earlier, remarked, "Had I a thousand tongues, I would praise Him with them all," hence the origin of this memorable title. This hymn has always held a place of honor in the Methodist tradition. In practically every edition of the Methodist hymnal since 1780, it was the opening hymn.

Today, organ works of Dieterich Buxtehude will be heard as part of the service. Buxtehude (1637-1707) spent a great portion of his career as the Organist for the Marienkirche in Lübeck, in the north of Germany- one of the most prestigious musical positions in all of Europe. His skill as a composer and organist was highly regarded and he was a major influence, particularly on Johann Sebastian Bach, who traveled to Lübeck from Central Germany on foot (over 250 miles) to study with him for several months and to hear his famed "Abendmusiken," an annual series of concerts taking place at the Marienkirche on the five Sundays before Christmas.
