MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES

Christ Church Choir will sing Healy Willan's *O Sacred Feast* at the Offertory this Sunday. This text is an English translation of the original Latin hymn, *O Sacrum Convivium*, most likely written by St. Thomas Aquinas in the 13th Century. British by birth, Willan emigrated to Canada in 1913 and first served St. Paul's Church, Bloor St., Toronto's largest church. Willan's passion for Anglo-Catholic worship and music led him eventually to become the Organist and Choirmaster at the Church of St. Mary Magdalene, also in Toronto, where he remained until his death in 1968. His *Missa Sancta Maria Magdalena*, sung by congregations in the American Episcopal Church since its inclusion in The 1940 and 1982 Hymnals, originated from Willan's renowned church.

In Britain for many years, it was customary for the Archbishop of Canterbury to confer the Lambeth Doctorate (Mus. D Cantuar) on a distinguished English cathedral musician. In 1956, Willan, "the Dean of Canadian composers" became the first non-English church musician to receive this honor. Willan enjoyed demystifying his pious image as a church musician. Regarding his roots, he once said that he was: "English by birth; Canadian by adoption; Irish by extraction; Scotch by absorption."

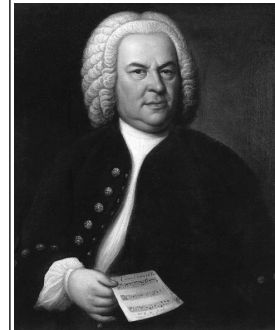

IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF J.S. BACH: A SPRING 2020 TOUR TO GERMANY



In the Spring of 2020, Christ Church's Organist and Director of Music, William Trafka will lead a tour to Germany to visit the towns and churches where the composer lived, worked, and wrote his greatest works. Bill will also play Bach's organ works in the magnificent sacred spaces, some centuries old, where they most likely were first intended to be heard and on some of the original instruments which Bach played over 300 years ago.

The tour will visit the charming towns of Eisenach (Bach's birthplace), Mühlhausen, Arnstadt, and Weimar as well as the major cities of Erfurt, Dresden, Leipzig and Berlin.

The tour will take place from **May 20 to May 30, 2020**, at the height of the Spring season in this opulent part of Central and East Germany. The accommodations are superb as is the wonderful German cuisine, particularly as experienced at the iconic Auerbachs Keller, built in 1438 and featured in *Goethe's Faust*. Experience the wonderfully inspiring music of Bach amidst the immortal richness of German history and culture.
